# About the National Agricultural Library

- Houses one of the world's largest collections including more than 8.1 million print and physical format items devoted to agriculture and its related sciences, with both physical and digital collections
- One of five U.S. National Libraries
- Congressionally designated depository for U.S. Government documents
- Departmental library for USDA

1.1 million+ print collection materials

Access to 440,000+ eBooks

8 million+ digital items

211,000+ items digitized for the Internet Archive


Access to 117,000+ ejournals & 5,200+ newspapers

  - a historical decuments




# PubAg

PubAg is a free, searchable database containing links to USDA –authored and funded peer-reviewed journal articles 300,000+ full-text articles relevant to the agricultural sciences


indexed citations to peer-reviewed journal articles in the agricultural sciences

#### Funding Resources

The process of securing funding through grants involves multiple stages, from initial discovery to application and management. This guide provides links to tools and databases that provide substantial support for each phase of the grant-seeking process.

#### USDA and Federal Information

National Agricultural Library - Guide to Funding Resources: A clearinghouse of information for every part of the funding process, including grant-writing resources.

National Agricultural Library - Funding Resources by Topic: Curated lists and descriptions of funding opportunities organized by specific topics of interest within agriculture and rural development.

<u>USDA Rural Development State Offices</u>: Employees in these offices are experts in federal funding opportunities provided by the USDA and can offer guidance on application procedures and eligibility requirements. Additionally, they may have insights into other local funding opportunities.

<u>Congressional Research Service - Resources for Grantseekers:</u> Describes key sources of information on government and private funding and outlines eligibility for federal grants. This report also includes some sources for information on writing grant proposals.

#### State and Local Funding Information

**Community Foundations**: The Council on Foundation <u>Community Foundation Locator</u> provides a map of accredited community foundations across the country. Community foundations are public charities that are focused on supporting a specific geographic location.

<u>State Departments of Agriculture</u>: Various states have funding opportunities specific to their agricultural needs and initiatives.

**Public and University Libraries**: Libraries often provide free access to the Foundation Directory Online (FDO), a comprehensive tool for finding funding sources, including grants and scholarships. The FDO is equipped with advanced visualization tools that allow users to analyze funding distribution across various topics and regions within the United States. Consult your <u>local</u> or university librarian for assistance using the FDO and finding local funding resources.

Alternative Online Research Tools: Charity Navigator and GuideStar provide information about numerous charitable organizations and their operations. These platforms are accessible alternatives for those who do not have access to fee-based databases, providing substantial insights into the non-profit sector.
