Benson and Higgins Receive Retiree Scholarships

Brian Helms, Extension fund development officer, representing the retiree editorial board, presented two scholarships of \$500 each to Ray Benson and Kristin Higgins at the Retiree Luncheon at the Galaxy Conference on April 1 at the Winthrop Rockefeller Institute on Petit Jean Mountain.


Ray Benson, county Extension agent - staff chair in Mississippi County, Delta District, is pursuing a doctorate in Environmental Sciences at Arkansas State

University. His research involves measurements to help define crop management zones for fields in Northeast Arkansas to help in identifying more efficient uses of precision agriculture.

He said that "having University of Arkansas Division of Agriculture guidelines for site specific management of fields with varying soil types will help producers become more efficient and help reduce negative environmental impacts associated with over-fertilization of soil type zones subject to nutrient leaching."

Kristin Higgins, program associate - Public Policy, is pursuing a masters of science degree in Agricultural and Extension Education at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville. She developed and implemented the Arkansas Watershed Stewardship program in eight priority watersheds in the state. She was also responsible for the 2014 ballot issue education program, monitoring the changing ballot situation, producing fact sheets and videos, updating the website and training agents.

Higgins said that "each class has given me a new tool or understanding that helps me in daily Extension work. For example, I chose to evaluate

Extension's ballot issue education program for my thesis using the steps and procedures I learned in school. Once completed, the evaluation will undoubtedly improve our future ballot issue programs, which exist to increase voters' knowledge and confidence in their decisions."

The Extension retiree scholarships support professional development opportunities for Extension faculty and staff. Including this year's winners, the Retiree Scholarship has been awarded to 11 Extension employees, for a total of \$5,500.

Randel Price Dies

Randel Keith Price, Ph.D., of North Little Rock, died March 15, 2015, at age 89.

He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Margaret Miles Price; two sons, Randel M. Price of Memphis, Tenn., and Douglas K. Price of Fairfax, Va.; two siblings, Arraminta Web of Houston, Tex., and Robert Price of Stephens, Ark; and one grandchild.

Price attended Magnolia A&M before enlisting in the army in 1943. He served with the 342nd infantry in the U.S., Europe and the Philippines, receiving the Combat Infantry Badge and Bronze Star.

After earning a B.S. in animal husbandry from Louisiana State University in 1948, he joined the Arkansas Cooperative Extension Service and served as a county agent in Poinsett, White and Prairie counties. He later served as an assistant professor at the University of Arkansas before taking a leave of absence to complete his Ph.D. in Extension administration from the University of Wisconsin - Madison.

From 1962 to 1971, Price was professor of Extension education at the University of Missouri; he then became director - training and staff development, for the University of Missouri Extension System. In 1979, he returned to Arkansas to serve as the associate director - field operations for Arkansas Extension, subsequently serving as interim director, before retiring in 1988.

A memorial service was held at the North Little Rock Funeral Home on March 19 with interment at the Arkansas State Veterans Cemetery, North Little Rock.

She lived in Arizona from 1952 until 1977. She returned to Arkansas and resided in Little Rock until 1993 when she moved to Kerrville to be near her daughter, Susi.
