After her husband transferred back to Arkansas seven years later, Dinnan worked at the Russellville Area Agency on Aging for a year. Then she returned to Extension, this time in Conway County. She was there 10 years when she retired February 2009.

Dinnan enjoys reading and restoring an old, twostory home in Morrilton.

"I do stay busy," she said. You think you won't when you retire, but you do."

NOTE: There is a fee for each of these tours and classes. There is also a class size limitation for many of them, so you will need to register and pay for any Arkansas Adventure activity ahead of time.
- Poster Session There will be a poster presentation session conducted on the evening of Wednesday, March 28. Posters will be presented that represent some of the best work by Extension educators from across the state.
- Guest Speakers We will hear from speakers about what is going on in Extension and the Division of Agriculture, as well as from experts on how to tell Extension's story and dealing with the future. NOTE: Several of these presentations will be made during meals, so participants will need to register for those meals (see registration form for meal prices).
- Auctions We will conduct both a silent auction and a live auction of items and services donated for the Galaxy
 Conference. Proceeds from the auctions go to the four Extension professional associations that plan and conduct the
 conference.

If you wish to spend one or two nights at the Orchard, the inserts in this month's *Extension Cord* provide you information on how you might reserve a room. The 10 rooms in the Orchard are on a first-come basis. If the Orchard fills up, there are additional housing options at the Winthrop Rockefeller Institute.

Please consider joining us for the retiree luncheon and for the entire Galaxy. Retirees who have attended have thoroughly enjoyed themselves.
