4-H Members Get Hands On At Arkansas' First Makerspace

Did you know there is a makerspace in central Arkansas that is perfect for 4-H groups?

Lonoke and Prairie County 4-H members recently visited Arkansas' first makerspace – the Arkansas Regional Innovation Hub in North Little Rock, for a fun-filled day of hands-on STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) education. The Hub provides an environment where students can make, create, explore, invent and design under the guidance of experienced mentors. 4-H

members were exposed to a variety of creative possibilities within the makerspace.

During a coding workshop, 4-H youth learned to use Arduino microcontrollers, which are printed circuit boards designed for a versatile platform. Students learned how to write code in C++ for motors, sensors, lights and buzzers; all of which can come together on an Arduino to form a fully functioning robot. Youth also attended a session on engineering. Through problem solving and hands on activities, they learned their creativity is just as important as their knowledge. From building bridges and towers, to changing the way paper behaves as a material, the goals and concepts of engineering were made approachable.

Other STEM field trip options include video and 3D design, laser cutting, flight, and electricity. The Innovation Hub also offers Art & Design field trips in the areas of screen-printing, printmaking, ceramics, and image transfers. Each field trip cost ranges from \$6-\$12 per student, and lasts about 2 hours.
