Recipe of the Quarter Apple Cake by Rose Dearin-Ozark District

INGREDIENTS CAKE

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 3 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar, lightly packed
- 1 1/8 cups canola oil
- 2 teaspoons pure Vanilla extract
- 4 cups baking apples, peeled and cute into small cubes, (about 3 large)* (granny smith or honey crisp)
- 1 cup raisins, regular or baking
- 1 1/4 cups coarsely chopped pecans or walnuts

PRALINE ICING (optional)

- 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) unsalted butter
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar, lightly packed
- 3 tablespoons milk (maybe a tiny bit more for spreading or drizzling consistency)
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to <u>350 degrees</u>. Oil and flour pan (preferable a bundt) CAKE


- 1. In a medium bowl, sift together the flour, salt, baking soda, cinnamon, and nutmeg and set aside.
- 2. To a large mixing bowl, add the eggs, sugars, oil, and vanilla and mix on medium speed until well combined. Add the dry ingredients and mix just until the flour is almost incorporated. Add the apples, raisins, and nuts and mix again, just to incorporate.
