A lot came from it, and will continue to come from it. Foremost on the list was concern for the courthouse. There are now several groups working on grants. They got \$210,000 from the state legislature for it.

It is so important to get the people involved. There was discussion about passing a 1-cent sales tax to hire an economic developer. The newspaper editor said, "There is no need to do this – you [the VISION 2010 group] have already done it."
