# Early Voting Underway in Arkansas Issue 4 Ok'd for Ballot

Arkansans had their first opportunity Monday to cast votes in the 2014 election, which included ballot issues such as the Arkansas Alcoholic Beverage Amendment that survived a court challenge.

The Arkansas Supreme Court on Thursday rejected a request to remove the proposed amendment also known as Issue 4 from the 2014 ballot. Challengers had said signatures for Issue 4 were submitted after the Constitutional deadline for ballot issues. Sponsors submitted their petitions on July 7, the state's deadline for ballot signatures because July 4 was a national holiday and offices were closed.

<u>Court justices</u> sided with the Secretary of State and petition sponsors over the deadline in saying that July 7 was sufficient because of the holiday. The court also rejected concerns raised about the proposal's ballot title.

Challenges seeking to remove an ethics amendment and state minimum wage initiative are still in court. The remaining two disputed issues do appear on the 2014 ballot for early voters. If the court rules to remove an issue, votes already cast on that ballot proposal would not be counted. If the court rules that the issues should remain on the ballot, votes on the ballot proposal would be counted.

## Looking Forward - 2016 Ballot

#### **Attorney General Opinions**

#### Rejected

Oct. 17, 2014 - The Arkansas Hemp and Marijuana Amendment - A ballot measure to legalize the cultivation, manufacturing, distribution, sale, purchase, possession and use of the cannabis plant in Arkansas was rejected for the second time this month. <a href="Opinion No. 2014-113">Opinion No. 2014-113</a> cited ambiguities in the ballot title and grammatical issues such as "subject-verb disagreements; use of plural antecedents with singular nouns and pronouns; unconventional usage in a number written in words; unconventional rendering of "and/or"; and repetitive and adjacent use of both a punctuation mark and a word meaning the same thing." Mary L. Berry of Summit submitted the measure.

#### **Approved for circulation**

**Aug. 5, 2014** - The Arkansas Hemp and Cannabis Amendment - A ballot measure to legalize the cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, possession and use of the cannabis plant in Arkansas was certified for signature gathering. Opinion No. 2014-079 said the proposed constitutional amendment was identical to a previously approved measure. Frederick W. Porter of Hot Springs submitted the measure.

**Aug. 14, 2014** - The Arkansas Medical Cannabis Act - A ballot measure to legalize the use of medical marijuana, and a system for growing and selling medical marijuana was certified for signature gathering. The ballot measure was similar to a recent proposal that did not receive enough signatures for the 2014 ballot. In Opinion No. 2014-086, the Attorney General cautioned the group that "according to my experience there is a direct correlation between the length and complexity of initiated acts and their susceptibility to a successful ballot title challenge." Melissa Fults, campaign director of Arkansans for Compassionate Care 2016, submitted the measure.
