
What are we voting on?

For the last time this election cycle, we offer a recap of the three statewide ballot issues Arkansas voters will be deciding on Election Day. Voting locations will be open Nov. 6 from 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. You can find our full voter guide at uaex.edu/ballot.

Issue 2 - A constitutional amendment that would require Arkansans to present photographic identification when voting in person and via absentee ballot.

Issue 4 - A constitutional amendment that would allow casino gaming at one location in Jefferson and Pope counties, and at Oaklawn in Hot Springs and Southland in West Memphis.

Issue 5 - A state law that would increase Arkansas' minimum wage from \$8.50 per hour to \$9.25 per hour in 2019, then to \$10 per hour in 2020 and to \$11 per hour in 2021.
