FALL CAMPING AND HIKING TRIP

The Trip

Heads up campers and hikers! The Fulton County 4-H Outdoor Adventure Club will have our fall trip on Friday, November 3rd and Saturday, November 4th. Location will be determined at a later date.

Eligibility, Registering, and Transportation

The trip is open to Fulton County 4-H members ages 13 and up. If you know someone who isn't enrolled in 4-H, all they need to do is give us a call and we'll gladly enroll them, but they must be enrolled to go. The cost is \$10 per participant. Parents are welcome to come along too! **We are, however, limiting the number of participants at 15 youth.** So, don't wait around too long to sign up! Give us a call at 870-895-3301 if you plan to attend. Deadline to register is Tuesday, 10/31.

Parents, we've got a couple of options for getting everyone where they need to be. For office staff and 4-H leaders who are attending, we have limited seating room. At best, we can haul around 7-8 kids ourselves.

Option 1: You can drop them off with us at on Friday evening and then plan to pick them up on Saturday afternoon.

Option 2: Brad, MaLinda, and/or 4-H leader Amy Walling can haul your kid there and back as seating room permits. You'd have to drop them off with us in Salem on Friday, and then we'd bring them back to Salem on Saturday. Again, we can only haul so many, so first come first serve. When you call and register, if this is the option you decide on, let us know then.

Gear and Supplies

If we get the campgrounds we want, we possibly will be camping right beside our vehicles. In that case, kids won't need that much gear on the trail. It's early November, so it wouldn't be out of the ordinary to have a cold night (below 40). We'll pay attention to the weather in the week leading up to the trip, and if it looks like it's going to be bitterly cold or have wintery precipitation, we'll cancel the trip. Here's what we'll provide and what we'll expect the kids to bring themselves.

4-H Provides: food, cookware, serving ware, supervision, planning, shuttling

Participant: tent, sleeping bag, water bottle (at least 1 quart), sturdy over-the-ankle hiking shoes/boots, camp chair, a warm jacket, warm socks, a toboggan or warm head covering, light backpack to carry their water, their jacket, etc. We'll stash the tents, sleeping bag, blankets, chairs, etc. back in the cars and not take them on the trail.

FORESTRY & WILDLIFE CAMP

There will be a Forestry & Wildlife Camp on November 3rd – 5th at the 4-H Center. This camp will be learning a variety of topics related to forestry and wildlife. This camp is open to the following 4-H'ers: basic (10-13) and advanced (14-18) age groups. Adult volunteers are welcomed. The cost will be \$145. Deadline to sign up is October 13th and registration is now open on 4-H Online.

It's National 4-H Week-- open (county specific)

Provide the local newspaper with articles written by members, volunteers, alumni and donors or do PSA about 4-H at your local radio station.

October 3- Wear Green Day!! Proclamation Signing at Fulton County Courthouse.

Advertise a wear-green day. Distribute green and white mints to everyone who wears green that day; or distribute tickets to a fun 4-H event. Use social media to announce (Facebook or Twitter) the event and post photos on Facebook, or the Website.

October 4-Citizenship Day!!!

Host an "appreciation day" for police officers, the fire department, elected officials, city/county employees, teachers, or others. Set up a 4-H exhibit at the County Court house and talk to county officials and the public about 4-H.

October 5- Make a 4-H Video Day!!!

Have 4-H'ers make a promotional video or Podcast. Post on the county or state website, Facebook or YouTube

October 6-Donor & Supporter's Recognition Day!!!

Have 4-H'ers write thank you notes; Mail them a DVD, pictures or videos of the past year's 4-H highlights or Distribute One Million Dollar candy bars with a note **You're worth more than this. Thanks for being a friend to 4-H.**

October 7- Local Restaurant Day!!!!

Select 2 to 3 restaurants in your county and place 4-H promotional place mats in the restaurants. **4-H Placement are available through print on demand. You must use your active directory password to order.**
