Youth ages 5-19 can compete on the county level, youth ages 9-19 can compete at the district, and senior 4-Hers can attend State O'Rama in Fayetteville. Contest offered are public speaking, health talk, talent, food fair, and many other options. If you are unsure what to compete in, call the office and Mrs. Samantha will help you prepare for a competition.
