The financial program, "Get Real-Here's the Deal" has been scheduled for <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 29</u>, at Nashville Junior High with 8th Grade students. This program gives students the opportunity to



experience real life financial decisions families must make each month. Students learn basic budgeting, maintaining a checking account by making financial transactions which provide necessary needs like housing, transportation, food and clothing, insurance and more. Each student is given an occupation and a family. They make monthly financial decisions and learn to stay within their budget. They also learn the role education plays in determining future wealth.
