December brought many avid gardeners wonderful gifts stuffed in our mailboxes-- several seed catalogs. Perusing seed catalogs can make gardeners feel like kids at Christmas.

If you are old enough to remember the Sears and Roebuck Wish Book that arrived in the mailbox for the holidays, I always think of seed catalogs as the Wish Book for gardeners.

While there are plenty of seed companies that boast and host the same offerings online, I prefer to pore over the hard copy catalogs. This way, I can flip and dog ear the pages, underline certain passages or information and fold catalog pages in half to see how items on different pages would look together.



From a timing perspective, the arrival of seed catalogs is a form of divine intervention.

It helps us while away the time wistfully, dreaming of the possibilities that come with the highly anticipated growing season.

Gardeners are planners and horticulture architects of beauty and sustainability.

Perusing those catalogs is a favorite pastime with the longer nights of the winter season. They myriad varieties of vegetables, fruits and flowers are endless, as are the possibilities for plotting and planning these beauties. No gardener has as much planting space as they want for their carefully curated seed collection.

The new varieties of seeds, and number of seed companies, also know no bounds. Yet, we must narrow down our seed planting/growing wish list to match our financial and planting space situations.

Catalog layouts and specialties also offer variety. Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds has an extensive offerings and stunning photography. The descriptions are wonderful. Baker Creek allows us to take an exotic trip, horticulturally speaking, as the company offers an array of rare seeds spanning the globe. I've never indulged to purchase their Baker Creek Whole Seed catalog, though I've been tempted numerous times. My reasoning for self-denial comes from finding plenty I want to order from the company's free catalog.

One of my favorite catalog covers, which reminds me of a Mary Englebright greeting card, is Southern Exposure.

Seed catalogs' welcome letters about what is new and how their year went are always enjoyable dispatches from fellow plant lovers.

Other popular seed companies publishing catalogs include: --Johnny's, which offers extensive information on its seeds and plants; --Gurney's, known for its good deals and coupons; --and Burpee, which offers seedlings, trees, and a wide array of gardening supplies. Other favorite seed catalogs include High Mowing, Park and so many others.

I don't believe I'm the only one that actually holds onto past catalogs for reference, information and inspiration.

Of course, after ordering from seed catalogs, we receive our actual envelopes and the seeds enclosed will get our nurturing and attention for weeks and months to come. Depending on our growing success or lack thereof, we will be satisfied or in a tizzy trying to save the plants.

Volunteer Time On Line Reporting System

To be backup January 15th to place in volunteer Hours.

This is how we ended the year 2022. Sanctioned hours 4809.25, Non sanctioned hours 211.25 and Education hours 1947.5 placed into the on line system. This is great.

Our top 3 on volunteer hours for 2022 (sanctioned and non sanctioned combined) are Clyde Davis with 592.5, Chead Blue with 424.25 hours, and Annette Lachowsky with 245.5 hours. Great Job!

Hours Required for 2023

Trainees (our Annuals) Remember you need 20 Sanctioned hours, 20 Non Sanctioned hours, and 20 hours of Education to become a Certified Master Gardener

Trainees I will be sending you information when I have loaded you into the on line reporting system. Remember I have to wait till the on line system in back up.

Membership (our Perennials) you need 10 Sanctioned hours, 10 Non Sanctioned hours, and 20 hours of Education for recertification.

Lifetimers you need 10 Sanctioned hours to keep you years counting.

Just a reminder that extra sanctioned hours will help take care of any needed hours on non sanctioned and education. Also extra non sanctioned will take care of any needed hours on education. Education hours are that education only.

Remember All of your hours are important and needed to keep MG programs going. Your hours help get grants for MG programs. State does reports during the year that show how many hours MGs have worked, so do not wait get your hours in.

Hours earned from Dec 15th 2022 and Jan 15th 2023 I hope you are keeping up with. These hours may be bulked into the system. Just pick a date (a current date — starting with Jan 15th) and place them in. Place hours under the project you were/are working on and you may bulk in up to 24 hours for a day. The system is not set up to let you place in more than 24 hours per day.
