Each contestant may enter only one division PER contest.

DAIRY & RICE RECIPE CONTEST - Two divisions per contest: *Party Ideas & Main Dish*. There must be dairy products in the dairy recipe and rice in the rice recipe. Recipes will be judged on ready availability

of ingredients, clearness, and accuracy of recipe, serving suggestions and other ideas on entry recipe, originality, and enhancement of the recipe by use of dairy or rice products. All cooking will be done on your own **BEFORE** you arrive to the Office. You will need to bring your dish ready for judging. You may use the kitchen to plate up your final dish and make last minute preparations of garnishes, if needed. You must provide your own dish, plate, etc. to turn in your finished product to the judges. Notice that the score sheet includes "appearance of prepared food". Depending on what you make, you may want to either turn in the whole prepared dish, or a portion on a separate platter, plate, dish, etc.

Cloverbud participation will be limited to the Party Idea Division. Cloverbud recipes should be simple and not require stove top cooking, baking or microwaving. Recipes to consider are dips, cheese balls, desserts or appetizers.

No parents or leaders are allowed to assist the youth while cooking their recipes.

NOTE: Be sure to place your name, club, and whether you're a cloverbud, junior, or senior, on your RECIPE.

It's time! Sign up for the 4-H Poultry Chain! **Deadline is Friday, February** 24! You MUST be a 4-H member to

participate by February 25; waiting on registration system. The cost will be \$25 per youth. Each youth will receive 15-20, one-day old White Leghorn chicks in April. The 4-Her will then raise these birds, have them blood tested in August, and then they will bring three hens to the County Fair on September 11 to be auctioned off. The participants will then write several "thank you" cards to poultry buyers and be eligible to pick up their check from the Extension Office. There will be <u>NO</u> extra birds ordered! Federal Junior Duck Stamp Art Contest

The Federal Junior Duck Stamp Conservation & Design Program is a dynamic art- and science-based curriculum that teaches wetland and waterfowl conservation to students in kindergarten through high school. The program encourages students to explore their natural world, invites them to investigate biology and wildlife management principles and challenges them to express and share what they have learned with others via the ART CONTEST. This program is FREE to enter and participate!

Students can enter their original depiction of waterfowl to the contest. Student artwork is judged in four groups according to grade level:

K-3, 4-6, 7-9 and 10-12.

To enter the 2023 contest, please ensure the following reminders.

-Artwork can be submitted before but not after, MARCH 15, 2023. Late submissions will not be accepted.

-Physical size of art must be 9×12 " and less than 1/4" thick.

-Image must be a live portrayal of a native North American duck, swan or goose (refer to Eligible Species list).

-There can be no lettering, writing, or signatures on the front of the artwork.

-Art must be portrayed horizontally.

-Be original! Just like copying on a test is cheating, copying your art directly from someone's picture is cheating too.

-Each piece of art must have a completed entry from, with signatures, attached to the back. (small piece of tape works best).

-Grades 7 -12 must also SUBMIT a visual reference FORM with their artwork.

Ross Photography Contest

The Ross Foundation 4-H Photography Contest is underway. This contest provides an opportunity for Arkansas 4-H'ers to demonstrate, compete and



exhibit their photography skills. All 4-H members aged 9-19 are eligible.

At the county level, each 4-H member may enter two color photographs (*one must be in the living category and one must be in the non-living category*) and two black-and-white photographs (*one must be in the living category and one must be in the non-living category*).

Photographs entered MUST be of scenes or subjects in Arkansas. Photos will be entered digitally. The photo may be enhanced to improve quality - and you may change a color image into black and white. Plant life (*flowers, trees, bushes*) are considered non-living for this contest. **Deadline: APRIL 7**

Game of the Month

Need an idea for your next 4-H Club meeting??? *Give & Take* What you'll need: one rolled up newspaper, a box Rules:

Players are all seated in a circle with a box in the

center. A "wand" (rolled up newspaper) is placed in the box. The player who is "IT" stands in the center, takes the wand, taps any person in the circle on the knee, and places the wand back in the box. The player that was tapped grabs the wand out of the box and tries to tap "IT" before he or she can sit down in the empty spot. If he succeeds, he places the wand back in the box and sits down before "IT" can tap him again. If he does not succeed, he takes the place of "IT". (Buchele, 2008)

TIME TO PLAN FOR GARDENS

It is winter and like it or not, spring, with warmer weather will not be here for a while. However, it is time to plan for the things you want to have in your vegetable gardens. It is time to make your list of the things you would like to have. The internet allows us to browse and order the seeds we want and also will give you instructions on how and when to start plants from seeds early in a warm inside environment. My husband and I started several plants last year just off our living room where it is warm, cozy and also has quite a bit of natural light. It was exciting to see the seeds sprout and come to life into seedlings. We started several varieties of Bell Peppers, Chile Peppers, Loofah and more. It is also much less expensive to start plants yourself and so much fun. When you transplant them to the outside, they will have a head-start on the growing season and you will feel much satisfaction that you started them yourself.
