

Internal Parasites Seen in Horses

Parasite **Ages Affected Injury & Symptoms Organs Affected** All ages, but young is Retarded growth Larvae – arteries, liver and gut wall especially susceptible Loss of weight Poor appetite Strongyles Rough hair coats Adults – large (Bloodworms) General weakness intestine Anemia Diarrhea Recurrent colics Death Larvae – liver & Young (under 2 years of Retarded growth lungs Pot bellied age) Ascarids Rough hair coat **Digestive** upsets (Roundworms) Adults – small intestine Pneumonia Death (ruptured intestine) Excitement (by flies) Eggs – on hair All ages **Digestive** upsets **Bots** Larvae - tongue and gums Bots - stomach Larvae - large Larvae affect all ages Tail rubbing intestine **Pinworms** Adults – large intestine and rectum Larvae - lungs and Foals Diarrhea small intestine Dehydration Strongyloides Weight loss (Threadworms) Adults – small intestine Larvae - small All ages Retarded growth intestine Weight loss Tape worm Colic Adults - large intestine and cecum
