



# 2025 Soybean Research Verification Program Weekly Update June 20, 2025

<b>General</b>	<p>By Chris Elkins.</p> <p>Rain amounts are starting to slow in areas and irrigation may start as early as next week. Clay County received the most rain with 2.75" and Craighead County received the least amount of rain with .29". One field is still waiting to be planted. Insect and disease pressure remain minor. Refer to table below for field specific information.</p>

Arkansas 1	NK 42T5XF	R3	Received 2.22" rain, Majority of field has canopy, bottom end of field delayed from excess water, insect and disease pressure remains low. Initial irrigation scheduled for 6/27.
Arkansas 2	Pioneer P49Z02E	R2	Received 1" rain, excellent growth, should canopy soon, remains clean. Initial irrigation scheduled for 6/29.
Clay	Pioneer P48Z70BLX	R2	Received 2.75" rain, should canopy soon, replants underwater, insect pressure remains low.
Craighead	Asgrow AG47FX2	V1	Received .29" rain, early V1, plant stand 100K plants/acre, remains clean, should continue to see good growth.
Jefferson	NK 43-W1XFS	R2	Received 1" rain, should canopy soon, insect pressure remains low, initial irrigation scheduled for 6/29.
Mississippi	Becks 4999XF	V6	Received .78" rain. Excellent growth, almost R1, good weed control.
Poinsett	Pioneer P48Z70BLX	V4	Received .65" rain, Continues to have good growth, newly emerged grass and broadleaves recommended 1 qt. Liberty + 1 qt. glyphosate + 1.25 pts s-metolachlor.
Prairie			Field remains wet, with more rain forecasted.
White	Pioneer P46A90LX	R5	Received 1.85" rain. Good pod set, insect pressure and disease pressure remain low. Rain expected to continue after scouting.
Woodruff	Asgrow AG46XF3	R5	Received 1.7" rain. Good branching, 90% canopy, Early R5, Insect and disease pressure remain low, Rain expected to continue after scouting.
