

## Arkansas Rice Research Verification Program Weekly Update

#### General Information

The Jefferson County field was the first to be fertilized and permanent flood established. Lonoke and White Counties should be sprayed this week and fertilized as the ground dries. The Chicot County field cannot catch a break in the rain and more chances are in the forecast. The Poinsett County field should be planted hopefully next week. The Woodruff County field has some stand reduction due to a Sharpen herbicide application.

Cross	RT 7521 FP*	1 <sup>st</sup> Tiller	Apply Preface (5 oz) + Facet L (32 oz) + 1 % COC. Apply 300 lbs Urea + NBPT and then permanent flood. Rain .45"
Chicot	DG 263 L+ (FIR)	DG 263 L	Planting delayed again from 3" rain with more chances coming this weekend.
Drew	RT 7521 FP (FIR)	3-Leaf	Apply Preface (5 oz) + Facet L (11 oz) + Permit Plus (.75 oz) + 1 % COC. Rain .72"
Jefferson	Ozark	3 <sup>rd</sup> Tiller	Permanent flood applied 270 Lbs Urea + NBPT according to N-STaR. Field flooded in 3 days. Rain 1.3"
Lonoke	RT 7521 FP*	2 <sup>nd</sup> Tiller	Apply Preface (6 oz) + Facet L (22 oz) + 1 % COC. Apply 300 Lbs Urea + NBPT according to N-STaR. Apply permanent flood. Rain 1.15"
Mississippi	RT 7321 FP* (FIR)	3-4-Leaf	Pre-emergence herbicides are starting to break will make recommendation next week.
Poinsett	Ozark	Ozark	Should plant next week.
White	RT 7521 FP*	2 <sup>nd</sup> Tiller	Apply Preface (6 oz) + (.25% NIS) Apply 300 lbs urea + NBPT. Apply permanent flood.
Woodruff	RT 7521 FP*	1-4-Leaf	5-10 % stand loss due to Sharpen post application (1 oz +COC) rice needing another 7 to 10 days to recover.
