


RICE FIELD SPELLING BEE

| | Farmers OLDOF their rice fields mainly to control weeds. Rice is a semiaquatic plant meaning it can live in water for long periods of time, where as weeds do not live in water very well. |
| | During VSATREH , the mature crop is separated from its stalk by using a piece of equipment called a combine. This is — — — — — — done 120-150 days after the rice seed is planted. |
| | After being harvested, rice is taken to a LIML where the husk and bran layers are removed to produce an edible, brown or white kernel |
| | IERC serves as a primary protein source for over half of the world's population. It is categorized as a swamp grass that is grown and used as a nutritious food source for humans and animals like ducks. |
| | Ranking number one in rice production, ASNKASRA — — — — — produces more then 40% of the U.S. rice production. |
