Patchwork Posies

Make a 9-patch "mug rug" with a pocket on the back to enclose a little inspirational verse or word (business card size). It measures 5"x 5", lined with light batting and is reversible. You can make it as a "Tooth Fairy Keeper" to help make a lost tooth easy to find under a pillow.

Supplies provided: die-cut color-coordinated squares of assorted fabrics, thread, needles, pre-cut batting, decorative card with choice of inspirational word and verse, pattern & directions. Skills required: While two or three sewing machines will be available for use, that is just a time/labor-saving option. We will be hand-piecing the 9-patch and doing a simple decorative running stitch around the perimeter of our "posies."

Blacksmithing Decorative Wall Hook

Students will make a twisted wall hook that can be attached to a wall or other surface with a pair of screws.

Requirements:

No synthetic-fiber clothing, not even blends. Long sleeves and pants, no shorts. Nothing you mind getting dirty or possibly burnt. Long hair should be tied back or otherwise restrained. Closed-toe shoes or boots with non-meltable tops. I will provide safety glasses.

Kumihimo Braid Bracelet

This Japanese style braid allows you to make cord that can be used as is for bracelets and key chains, or for embellishment on other projects.
