

# Maximizing your Walk Across Arkansas Experience: Using Technology to Meet Your Goals

#### Introduction

Most American adults get too little physical activity and spend more than half their waking hours being sedentary. These factors can negatively affect health, leading to increased chronic disease risk, obesity, and premature death. Walk Across Arkansas is an eight week, team based online program designed to increase physical activity levels through friendly competition and collaboration. This lesson is designed to provide an overview of the Walk Across Arkansas website so participants can fully engage in the program and meet physical activity goals.
