## Fordyce Emotions Questionnaire<sup>1</sup>

In general, how happy or unhappy do you usually feel? Check the *one* statement below that best describes your average happiness.

10. Extremely happy (feeling ecstatic, joyous, fantastic)

9. Very happy (feeling really good, elated)
8. Pretty happy (spirits high, feeling good)
7. Mildly happy (feeling fairly good and somewhat cheerful)
6. Slightly happy (just a bit above normal)
5. Neutral (not particularly happy or unhappy)
4. Slightly unhappy (just a bit below neutral)
3. Mildly unhappy (just a bit low)
2. Pretty unhappy (somewhat "blue," spirits down)
1. Very unhappy (depressed, spirits very low)
0. Extremely unhappy (utterly depressed, completely down)
