When judging the description of involvement section, I was looking to see if the Master Gardener was involved in all three aspects of the program: the county Master Gardener program, Extension, and the community. In the Master Gardener program, I liked to see leadership skills, mentorship, good conflict resolution, innovation, and amount of involvement. When involvement was reliable and consistent, such as a long-term involvement in particular projects or a large amount of involvement in a short amount of time as a Master Gardener, I scored them higher. I looked to see if Master Gardeners furthered the reach of Extension programs by making community connections and worked well with their Extension offices and employees.

For the images, I was looking for pictures that reflected what I read about in the description of involvement, such as pictures of the Master Gardener working on the specific projects mentioned. I thought it was helpful when nominations included text to explain the context that the picture was taken in. Some points were counted off for images that were unclear.

One that all counties should consider adding are numerical descriptors for service, such as the number of hours that they volunteered on each project, or the number of people reached with each project.

I chose John Doe as the Master Gardener of the year because of his relationships and involvement within his county's Master Gardener program, his involvement in the community through projects, service, the city, farmers markets to educate the public and attract new Master Gardeners, and his work as the Extension Council representative.
